Goals for 2024-2026



2025-2027 International Theme and Logo

Conway explained that circles represent wholeness, hold energy, and symbolize connectiveness. Teams gather in circles, friends circle around campfires, we create circles of friends, family, school teammates, and we create a circle when we sing "The Lamp of Alpha Delta Kappa". The circle in the logo consists of our three colors in Alpha Delta Kappa—green, yellow, and purple in an ombre effect. The circle



is not closed, which represents our ability to welcome new ideas and members. The circle is open to continue evolving as an organization to meet the needs of our current members. At the bottom, the ends split into 4 segments—a nod to our beginnings. The Alpha Delta Kappa triad is in the center.

Distinguished Program Recognition Application Now Open

Purpose

The Distinguished Program Recognition (DPR) acknowledges chapters with outstanding programs that reflect the purposes of Alpha Delta Kappa (Altruism, Excellence in Education, Inclusion/Diversity/Equity, World Understanding) as well as programs that focus on personal enrichment. Distinguished programs are unique, creative, and/or innovative. The programs provide ideas for other chapters to use when planning programs, and they promote attendance and involvement of members and prospective members.

Eligibility

Chapters may submit one program from June 1 through May 31 of the most recent program year.

Submission Period

Submit application between June 15- August 15.

Excellence-in-Education Award 2026

It's here! The application form for the Excellence-in-Education (EiE) Award is now open. The Excellence-in-Education (EiE) Award is our highest honor and recognizes educational excellence. This form has been streamlined with the entire application process combined into one form and one deadline of November 1, 2025.

The Alpha Delta Kappa Foundation recognizes the Texas recipient with a monetary award of \$500 and an EiE pin. A nomination narrative is required and can be provided by the applicant (self-nominated), a member, or a chapter designee. This narrative should include why the person is a worthy candidate and include a statement regarding the relationship to the nominee. This award increases visibility and promotes $A \triangle K$ at the state, regional and International levels.

"What is the meaning behind the Chapter Pearls?"

Did you know that each chapter is a participant in the pearl achievement awards for membership? Each year from June 1 to May 31, this achievement award "recognizes those chapters who implement the principles of sound membership development through effective communication of recruitment and retention." (cited from Alpha Delta Kappa Website). Chapters can receive certificates for having up to seven pearls if all the criteria are met. What is that criteria?

Here are the categories that could get your chapter to the top of the pearl achievement:

- 1. **Maintain Chapter Number:** The chapter must maintain the number of members throughout the year without member loss. So, if someone leaves the chapter, the members are tasked with recruiting another member to maintain the number of members originally in the chapter at the beginning of the annual year start of June 1.
- 2. **Initiate or reinstate members:** Gaining new members in addition to maintaining the original chapter number is part of this category.
- 3. **Annual Chapter Highlights H-114:** The chapter must make sure that this JotForm is completed, usually by the Chapter Secretary, by June 30.
- 4. Chapter attendance to Regional Conferences or International Convention depending on the year: Having a chapter member attend each of these events will give the chapter a pearl. (Virtual attendance is also acceptable!)
- 5. **Chapter Needs Assessment (CNA):** Chapter's original CNA needs to be completed during the first year of the biennium with a reflection of the CNA during the second year of the biennium. This is a JotForm with a deadline of October 15 (first year of biennium) and with the deadline of reflection on May 15 (second year of biennium). This form is usually completed by the Chapter President and the Chapter Membership Chair.
- 6. **Altruistic report:** The Chapter Altruistic Chair must get the chapter altruistic information on a JotForm by the deadline of March 15.
- 7. Chapter International Teacher Education (ITE) payment: This deadline is January 1 each year.

Once these 7 categories are met each year, the chapter can celebrate and receive the honor of being a seven pearl chapter. Use these as guidelines as a challenge to reinforce and make your chapter proud to be a part of the Alpha Delta Kappa world.
