If you do not already have an account, you will need to create one. Chapters completing the e-postcard will earn a pearl. This is required by the IRS.

BYLAWS UPDATE

The new International Bylaws were voted on prior to the convention in Austin and are posted on the website. If you have not had a chance to look at them follow these steps. Log on to the alphadeltkappa.org website. Click on Member Only and choose Resource Library. Under Guiding Documents and Policies go to the Governance and Organizational Documents. Scroll down and open ADK International Bylaws and Constitution Amended July 2025. You might read the entry below which is ADK and Procedures. You may recall that items that were in the previous International Bylaws were removed from that document and placed in Policy and Procedures. This could be a great Fraternity Education.

Remember that Texas voted to abide by the International Bylaws and have Policy and Procedures for the state. Go to the Texas website and review the state Policy and Procedures. Texas chapters no longer have bylaws. Chapters have Policy and Procedures. If you still have chapter bylaws, they are not valid. If you have questions about this, please let me know.

The Texas Alpha Delta Kappa Woman of Honor

During the month of January, chapters have an opportunity to nominate a deserving member to be the TX ADK of Distinction and a deserving woman to be the Texas ADK Woman of Honor. What are the differences between the two? The **TX ADK Woman of Honor** is awarded to a woman that is not a member of Alpha Delta Kappa and has served in Texas "by distinguishing herself in public service, in the arts, in science, in education, or in a special endeavor worthy of recognition." (From the application form.) In past years our state has honored women in law enforcement, women in political positions, women in news media, women in education, women in scientific areas, etc.

The **ADK of Distinction** has been awarded to outstanding Alpha Delta Kappa members who have been Alpha Delta Kappa members in good standing for at least ten years; have served as an officer or committee members above the chapter level; have attended at least two state conventions, one regional conference, and one international convention; and, have made notable contributions to the advancement of Texas Alpha Delta Kappa. Some notable honorees from past state conventions include Carol Johnson, Paula O'Neill, Ann Hudson, Kathy Smith, Carol Dugger, Olivia Cook, Paula Raeke, Carol Kovach, and Jan Snow.

Applications for the TX Women of Honor and the TX Alpha Delta Kappa of Distinction will be open after the first of the year with the deadline in March. Be thinking about who your chapter wants to nominate in the next few months.

Fall Mini Grant Opportunity!

The Fall Mini Grant of up to \$500 is due Oct 15. It is for non-ADK activities like workshops & conferences that take place from Jan 1 to May 1. Remember retired members may apply too. They might want to attend a flower making class or a non-degree college course on zoom or excel or QuickBooks and connect it back to chapter needs and present a program there or at district or S/P/N level, etc. South Central had several recipients for fall mini but not for spring mini. You need to apply!

To find the JotForm application go to the International website and find the Foundation tab, then find Scholarships, then scroll down to Grants. Under that is summary then purple boxes—find fall mini and read the rubric. You can't win if you don't apply!

Excellence-in-Education Award 2026

This is a quote from Paula O'Neill, IPP and from Texas Beta Chi: "As International Chairman for this award, I said at our International Convention last summer that many of us, or our students, had received awards because of our excellence in education. Let's continue to foster the recognition of outstanding teaching in Texas!"

As the students and many of our Alpha Delta Kappa Sisters have returned to the classroom, you might start to notice that you have an outstanding teacher in your midst. The application form for the Excellence-in-Education (EiE) Award is open and now is the time to begin the nominating process (essays and obtaining support letters) for a well-deserving AΔK Sister. The Excellence-in-Education (EiE) Award is our highest honor and recognizes educational excellence. This form has been streamlined with the entire application process combined into one form and one deadline of November 1, 2025. The Alpha Delta Kappa Foundation recognizes the Texas recipient with a monetary award of \$500 and an EiE pin. A nomination narrative/essay is required and can be provided by the applicant (self-nominated), a member, or a chapter designee. This narrative should include why the person is a worthy candidate and include a statement regarding the relationship with the nominee. This award increases visibility and promotes $A\Delta K$ at the state, regional and International levels. Consider nominating your outstanding AAK active educator Sister! For complete details visit alphadeltakappa.org and follow this path: Membership > Awards & Recognitions > Excellence-in-Education Award. The application process is through Kaleidoscope, an electronic company, and a link will appear for that company. The nomination can take place over a period of time and does not have to be completed in one day. It is wise to read all of the guidelines and information before starting the application. Members may selfnominate. The deadline for completion of the application is November 1, 2025.

Membership Matters!

The International Membership Committee (IMC) encourages chapter leaders to take a moment to review their goals for the 2024-2026 biennium with the Chapter Needs Assessment (CNA) process. The start of the biennium's second year is a perfect chance to look back on your goals—celebrating what has been achieved, learning from challenges, and considering any adjustments needed for the year ahead. State/Provincial/National (S/P/N) leaders will be contacting chapter leaders to have a conversation around the chapter goals prior to October 15, 2025. The intention of this check-in is to connect with chapters, celebrate successes, and offer support or resources where needed. This reflection is not going to be submitted using a JotForm and is not for a pearl.

Chapter leaders are encouraged to reflect with the chapter as a whole prior to the conversation with the S/P/N leader. Questions for reflection:

- What are you most proud of in the first year of the biennium with your chapter?
- What is the progression towards reaching each of the 2024-2026 goals?
- Does the chapter need to revise any of the goals?
- · Are there other goals that the chapter will work on this coming year?
- What support might your chapter need from the S/P/N Membership Team?

Planning for Fraternity Education Month

It is never too early to start planning ... next month is Fraternity Education Month and you may be wondering what to plan for a program. Let's look at a few great ideas.

The first thing to do is go to the Alpha Delta Kappa website. Log in. Click on the "Members Only" tab, then "Resource Library." When the Resource Library appears, click on the "All Members" tab. Under that section, click "Membership." Under "Membership" you will find "Fraternity Education Resources." When you click on that topic all these resources appear.

The topics include: A∆K Month Proclamation; Founders Individual Bios; Games – non-tech devices; Games – tech devices needed; Information, Skits & Days; videos; and programs.

You may print the A∆K Month Proclamation. Contact the mayor's office of your city and ask that the mayor proclaim the month of October as Alpha Delta Kappa Month. Get your sisters to join you at the signing of the proclamation and publish a picture and story with the local media.

There is a plethora of ideas and games listed under the various topics and all you would need to do is make copies of games such as "Seven Pearls Fraternity Ed", "A∆K Mad Libs", "A∆K Sister Tic Tac Toe", "Coffee Personality Test", "Find Someone Who", or "Hattie's Library", just to name a few.

When a computer is available, there are PowerPoint presentations that would be great to show at your meeting. Also, there are programs that everyone may participate in on their phone with the use of QR codes or website links. For example, "In Her Words" is a QR code program; "AAK Traffic Light" is a link game.

Take advantage of these resources available to you on the Alpha Delta Kappa website. The games, plays, skits, and information are ready for you and all you need to do is choose which one you would like to present to your chapter to celebrate Alpha Delta Kappa's founding, heritage, and legacy. It is literally at your fingertips.

Texas Chapter Merit Award

Don't forget about the Chapter Merit Award! The award is important for keeping our organization strong and relevant in today's world.

If each chapter accomplishes all the following tasks and becomes a six-merit chapter, Texas Alpha Delta Kappa will be making a difference for all Texas sisters. At the state convention in 2026, we will recognize chapters with these awards.

Merit #1

Communication: Send a minimum of six newsletters OR chapter minutes each year of the biennium to the state president (Shelly Couch shellycouchadk@gmail.com), the state president-elect (Robin Miller suvivorrobin@yahoo.com), the president of the chapter of council presidents Olga Cisneros (olgacisneros@gmail.com), and the district mentor.

Merit #2

Membership: Initiate or reinstate one member each year of the biennium OR host a membership event—includes either a tea, reception, party, or other fun event.

Merit #3

State Altruistic Project: Have a chapter program dealing with Children's Advocacy Centers of Texas OR participate in one of the Children's Advocacy Centers of Texas fundraisers OR make a project donation or monetary contribution to the Children's Advocacy Centers of Texas.

Merit #4

World Understanding: Have a minimum of one world understanding program each biennium.

Merit #5 (First year of the biennium only)

Chapter Policies and Procedures and Official Policy Statement: Send revised chapter policies and procedures AND official policy statement to the district president by March 1, 2025.

Merit #6 (Second year of the biennium only)

Nomination/Application Process--Pick one or more: Nominate an outstanding Texas Alpha Delta Kappa educator for the Excellence in Education (EIE) Award OR nominate an outstanding community leader to be considered by your district to be the district nominee for Texas Alpha Delta Kappa Woman of Honor OR nominate a sister for Texas Alpha Delta Kappa of Distinction OR have someone from your chapter apply for any Alpha Delta Kappa Scholarship or Grant (this may be from the first of second year of the biennium).






Texas Mini M.E.T.
